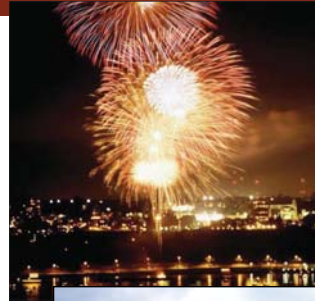




PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

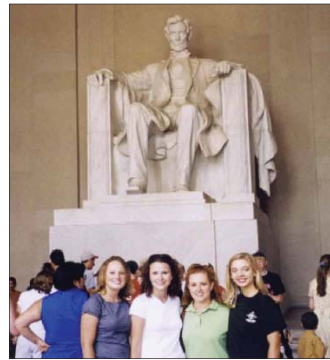
